



5. Flood Risk from Rivers





River Alyn at Rossett Flood Warning Area





















8. Main Rivers

9. Roles, Responsibilities and Actions for Flood Wardens

Actions	Notes	
Senior and Assistant Flood Wardens	 - A Senior or Assistant Flood Warden should be appointed. - The Senior Flood Warden will be the main point of contact for emergency services/NRW/Local Authority during an incident. - The Assistant Flood Warden will deputise if the Senior Flood Warden is unavailable. - A Senior and/or Assistant Flood Warden should always be available. 	
Person(s) responsible for reviewing the plan	 Arrange meetings as appropriate with all wardens to report any issues raised in the community and ensure the plan is up to date. Amend the Community Flood Plan as necessary and inform NRW of any amendments required. 	
Register to receive the Flood Warning Service	- Register on the Flood Warning System to receive all warnings associated with this plan.	
Zones	 Consider how the flood risk area should be split and shared between the Flood Wardens. Concentrate engagement/awareness efforts within each warden's zone. 	
Engage with residents	 Ensure that residents within their allocated area are aware of the Community Flood Plan and its content. Encourage residents to register to receive the free Flood Warning Service. To register; visit Natural Resources Wales' website: www.naturalresources.wales phone Floodline: 0345 988 1188 fill in a registration form and post it to Natural Resources Wales Provide relevant literature to residents, for example Natural Resources Wales' flood information pack. Ensure residents are aware of the Natural Resources Wales website and the Floodline service, to include the quickdial number. Encourage property owners to take own responsibility to protect their properties by providing them with relevant information. 	
Communication	- Communicate with relevant organisations as indicated in this plan. - The Flood Warden Group can utilise social media to better manage communication before, during and after an event.	
Assist all responding organisations	 Flooding information may need to be distributed to the community by relevant organisations. Flood Wardens can assist with the distribution of these materials as a group, and to confirm with the relevant organisation when all materials have been distributed. 	
Flooding Exercises	- If an exercise is organised, ensure that all relevant organisations are invited to attend and participate.	
Reporting flood risk issues	 If any issues arise prior to or during a flood, report to the relevant organisation via the Senior Flood Warden. This can include issues such as blockages to rivers or drains, damage to any flood defence structure, or any queries that have been raised by individual residents. 	
Respond to warnings as necessary	- If you are unavailable, for example working away, holiday, sickness etc. notify the Senior or Assistant Flood Warden.	
Keep a log of events	- Endeavour to keep a log of all correspondence between residents and organisations, prior, during and after a flooding event. This log can then be used during de-briefs.	
Sandbags	 It is the property owner's responsibility to instigate any actions, such as obtaining sandbags, to defend against occurrences of flooding to their property. It is highly recommended that sandbags are sourced by property owners prior to an event and stored in a dry place. To be aware of Wrexham County Borough Council's sandbag policy for future reference 	
Flood Wardens must not put their own lives at risk	 Consider your own health and safety at all times, and do not take any actions that may compromise your own or others safety. Do not enter floodwater; only trained professionals are fully aware of the dangers of floodwater, and are able to minimise the risks involved.

12. Flood Alert – Definition and Actions

Level of warning	Definition	Action
Flood Alert	Flooding is possible. Be prepared. Stay alert and vigilant. Low lying land and roads will be affected first. Farmers should consider moving livestock and equipment away from areas likely to flood.	All Flood Wardens can look on the Natural Resources Wales website www.naturalresources.wales for further information. Alternatively, Flood Wardens can call Floodline on 0345 988 1188 and key in quickdial number 191902 for further information. Flood Wardens to remain vigilant of local conditions and report any issues to the Senior Flood Warden. Flooding of property is not expected to occur at this level of warning, but flooding of low-lying land and roads is likely, possibly resulting in travel and communication difficulties. Please note: There will not be an automated message to inform members of the public when a Flood Alert is removed. This information will only be available on the internet and on Floodline.

13. Alyn Hotel Demountable Defence Trigger – Definition and Actions

Alyn Hotel Demountable DefenceTrigger	The Alyn Hotel Demountable Defences will be installed by Natural Resources Wales. This is due to predicted weather forecast which could result in high river levels. The Demountable Defences will be monitored and Flood Warning messages will be issued as appropriate.	Natural Resources Wales' Flood Incident Duty Officer (East) will contact the Senior Flood Warden to inform that the Alyn Hotel Demountable Defences will be installed. The Senior Flood Warden should cascade this information to the other Flood Wardens. There are no further actions for Flood Wardens to perform. This message will NOT be shared with the general public. Flood Wardens to remain vigilant of local conditions and report any issues to the Senior Flood Warden.

Flood Warning	Flooding is expected. Immediate Action Required. Take action now to prevent water getting into your home, move family pets and valuables to a safe place. If caught in a flash flood, get to high ground. Stay away from flood water and don't take risks. Consider one's own health and safety at all times, and do not take any actions that may compromise your own or others safety Remain vigilant of local conditions and report any issues to the Senior Flood Warden. Contact the Emergency Services immediately if the situation requires it. In addition the Senior Flood Warden should: Contact Natural Resources Wales' Flood Incident Duty Officer for further information on the Flood Warning issued. Cascade all relevant information to the other Flood Wardens. Report any issues to the relevant organisation. 16. Warning no longer in force – Definition and Actions

Warning no longer in force	No further flooding is currently expected for your area. Flood Warnings and Alerts may still be in force for surrounding areas. Flood water may still be around for several days.	If property flooding has occurred, Flood Wardens can signpost residents to information on what to do after a flood on the Natural Resources Wales website: www.naturalresources.wales Click on Flooding > Preparing for flooding > What to do after a flood As part of its investigation into the flood event, Natural Resources Wales will be in contact to gain feedback on what happened; were the Warning Messages received, at what time, was the plan activated, was there any flooding etc. In order to gain this information the Flood Plan Owner can arrange a meeting with all Flood Wardens. This feedback will assist Natural Resources Wales in performing any amendments to the Flood Warning Service as required.

17. Sandbags

The first contact for sandbags should always be Wrexham Borough Council If WBC is unable to provide sandbags, 140 emergency sandbags are stored at Parkside Farm – contact Andrew Steven (*Page 5*) if the sandbags are needed.
